Elizabeth Wilson is a graduate of Saugatuck High School and Grand Rapids Community College. For the past 28 years, she has served as the Athletic Administrative Assistant at Saugatuck Public Schools. In addition to her work in educational athletics, Elizabeth is also the PowerSchool manager, Pupil Accounting coordinator, substitute teacher coordinator, and a game manager for all middle school and football athletic events at Saugatuck. She is responsible for the coordination of officials and finances for all sports and clubs. For the past 12 years she has helped to organize the MITCA and Regional track meets and is a founding member of the Heart Team at Saugatuck, which was named as a "Heart Safe" school. Dr. Timothy Travis, Superintendent of Saugatuck Schools, writes "All small schools have 'that person' who seems to know how to connect people, solve problems, and get things done. Liz Wilson is 'that person' for Saugatuck Public Schools. Liz is first and foremost an advocate for our students and parents and routinely gives of her time to improve the school experience for our students. While many school employees go above and beyond for a time, there are few in my experience who have continued to serve with the same enthusiasm as Liz." Regional Athletic Directors of the Year

REGION 1 – CHRIS HARTMAN (Kingsford) is a graduate of Negaunee High School. He holds a Bachelor's Degree from Northern Michigan University and a Master's Degree in the Art of Teaching from Marygrove College. Chris began his career in education in 2001, taking a position as a Physical Education and Health Education teacher at Iron Mountain. In 2008, he was named the Athletic Director at Iron Mountain, a position he held for eight years. In addition to his Athletic Director role, Chris was named Dean of Students at Iron Mountain in 2015. After spending three years as a Badger Sporting Retail Salesman, Chris returned to education as the Athletic Director as Kingsford, where he has been the past two years. Al Unger, assistant principal at Kingsford High School, writes "Chris goes above and beyond his duties as an athletic director at Kingsford High School. He is key in working with the U.P. Athletic Committee and the MHSAA in coordinating officials and tournament sites. Being a former AD at Kingsford High School, I understand all the intricacies and many details that it takes to administer a vast middle school and high school athletic program. I say without any reservations, the athletic programs at Kingsford are in great hands and will flourish for years to come with Chris Hartman leading them." Before becoming an Athletic Director, Chris also spent time coaching middle school basketball and track along with high school tennis. He has been a member of the U.P. Athletic Committee for six years and an MHSAA Registered Basketball Official for 15 years. During his time as an official, Chris had an opportunity to officiate a MHSAA Girls Basketball State Championship game. In his free time, he enjoys spending time at camp, installing and maintaining sprinkler systems, and cutting grass. Chris is married to his wife Tara, a graduate of Kingsford High School, and has one daughter, Katie.

REGION 2 - MARTY MIX, CAA (Onaway) is a graduate of Onaway High School. He holds an Associate's Degree from Alpena Community College, a Bachelor's Degree from Grand Valley State University and a Masters Degree from Marygrove College. Marty began his career in education as a fifth-grade teacher, a role he held for five years before moving into an assistant principal position for one year. For the past 12 years, Marty has served as both the Athletic Director and Principal at Onaway High School. In addition, he has been very involved as a coach, serving as a Varsity Girls Basketball coach for 15 years, a Boys and Girls Cross Country coach for 14 years, and a Boys and Girls Varsity Track and Field coach for 18 years. An active member of MITCA, MASA, and BCAM, Marty has been selected as an Alpena News and Cheboygan Daily Tribune Coach of the Year honoree and has been awarded with MITCA dedicated service awards in both Cross Country and Track. Benjamin Tarbutton, president of the Ski Valley Conference, writes "Marty's performance as an Athletic Director sets the standard as to what qualities every school should look for when filling the role. He is the driving force for many of the successes his school and our conference have achieved. Marty's organization and perseverance in his quest to make his school and our conference one of the best conferences in Michigan is what makes our Ski Valley Conference members proud every year. His character and love for sports should be recognized beyond just the conference level." Marty has served as the Ski Valley President for 10 years, the Ski Valley Conference Sportsmanship Summit coordinator, and as an Onaway Chamber of Commerce Grand Marshal. An active member of the Onaway community, Marty has been a local Little League and AAU coach and tournament coordinator. In addition, he helps with tutoring services and before and after school mentoring programs at Onaway. Marty has three children, Jager (17), Jaden (15), and Jerzi (11), who are all very active in sports.

REGION 3 – **DAVE SKINNER**, CAA (McBain Northern Michigan Christian School) is a graduate of McBain High School. He holds a Bachelor's Degree from Western Michigan University along with a Master's Degree from Central Michigan University. Dave began his career in athletics as a Men's Basketball Manager and Graduate Assistant at Western Michigan University, also serving as a Varsity Boys, Varsity Girls and JV Boys Basketball coach at Kalamazoo First Assembly Christian while earning his undergraduate degree. During his graduate assistantship, Dave was offered and accepted an Assistant Basketball coaching position at San Jose Christian College in San Jose, California, and was eventually promoted to Head Coach. After two years at San Jose Christian College, he took a position at Bethany College in Scotts Valley, California, in 1998 and worked there for one year before returning back to Michigan to take the Big Rapids High School Boys Varsity Basketball coaching job in 2001. In 2004, Dave began coaching at McBain Northern Michigan Christian School, joining the Girls Varsity Basketball season midway through and leading the team to a District title. In 2005, Dave started the Boys Varsity Golf Program at McBain Northern Michigan Christian School and has been the varsity golf coach for 13 years across two stints, a position he still holds today. Dirk Walhout, Principal of Kalamazoo Christian Schools, notes that "Dave has always shown himself as a man of integrit – seeking and defending honesty, accuracy, and truth. He leads by example in these areas and articulates this trait as a high expectation for his coaches, students-athletes, and their parents. Over the years, Dave has developed a very positive rapport with a wide variety of people within the school community: students-athletes, parents, colleagues, and other stakeholders. Dave's interpersonal skills are definitely a valued asset for an administrative leader." Since 2008, Dave has served as the Athletic Director for McBain Northern Michigan Christian School and has also been a K-12 Physical Education teacher during that time. Dave coached Varsity Track at McBain Northern Michigan Christian School for four years and has stepped up to coach several middle school basketball teams for both boys and girls and spent one year as the Varsity Boys coach He has taken on a number of leadership roles with interscholastic and youth sport, including serving as the coordinator of the Missaukee-Osceola Youth Soccer Association for the past 10 years and President of the Northern Michigan Soccer League for the last eight years.

REGION 4 – KEVIN WOLMA, RAA (Hudsonville) is a graduate of Grandville High School. He holds his undergraduate degree from Alma College along with a Master's Degree in Educational Leadership from Grand Valley State University. After spending a year at Roscommon High School as a science teacher, Kevin has served at Hudsonville High School for the past 24 years. After 14 years as a Physical Education and Health teacher Kevin was named the Athletic Director at Hudsonville High School, a position he has held for the past nine years. Kevin has coached multiple sports during his time in educational athletics, coaching Freshman Basketball for a year at Roscommon, three years of Middle School Boys Basketball at Hudsonville, nine years of Varsity Boys Basketball (three years at Caledonia, six years at Hudsonville), six years of Varsity Girls Tennis at Hudsonville, over 10 years of Boys and Girls JV Golf at Hudsonville, and two years of Varsity Girls Golf at Hudsonville. Kevin has served as OK Red Conference President over the past three years and has initiated and led the OK Conference Leadership Summit, where student leaders from each conference school come together and discuss leadership and sportsmanship along with a component of diversity training and inclusion. He recently published a book titled "30 Second Timeout" that chronicles the challenges parents go through while navigating youth sports. Jordan Beel, Principal at Hudsonville High School, notes that "Kevin leads with a servant mentality, putting others before himself. He is an example of the highest moral character, and represents himself and our school as such. Kevin is a wonderful father and husband first and foremost, and that example shows through how he leads coaches, athletes, and our teaching staff as well." Kevin was named a Regional Golf Coach of the Year in 2010, the Ottawa County Substance Abuse and Prevention Coalition School Administrator of the Year in 2015, and the West Michigan Officials Athletic Director of the Year in 2015. Kevin has been married to his wife Gina for 22 years and has raised three beautiful children, Jordan (18), Kayla (18), and Kelsey (15).

REGION 5 – MIKE MOHN, CAA (Delton Kellogg) is a graduate of Delton Kellogg High School. He received a Bachelor's Degree from Oakland University in Communication and is currently enrolled in the Path to Leadership K-12 Administrator Certification program through the Michigan Association of Secondary Principals. Mike spent 23 years in the Social Services field with Holy Cross Children's Services before entering a career in education. For the past 10 years he has served as Athletic Director and Dean of Students at Delton Kellogg. In addition, Mike has also coached Basketball for 21 years at Delton Kellogg, spending 12 seasons as a Boys Varsity coach and the past nine as a Girls Varsity coach. Mike is a member of the Two Century Win Club for Varsity Basketball through BCAM. During his time as an Athletic Director Mike has taken on a number of leadership roles throughout the MIAAA. He currently serves as Co-Chair of the Educational Athletics Committee, a member of the Middle School Committee and a member of the Strategic Planning Committee. In addition, Mike is the MIAAA representative to the MHSAA Basketball Rules Committee and the MIAAA Region 5 Alternate representative. Mike has earned his MHSAA CAP Masters Elite certification and is now a CAP Instructor along with being an LTI Instructor. Lucas Trierweiler, Principal of Delton Kellogg High School, remarks that "Mike is always looking to build on our academic athletics with students and the community. He cares about facilities, sportsmanship, loyalty, and, first and foremost, students. He is quick to host events and he takes pride in putting on a good event where officials, teams, coaches, and spectators all feel welcomed. Mike has been a leader in our community and school for several years and he has built relationships with a foundation of integrity, honesty, forward thinking, and follow through." Mike has been married to his wife Jackie for 24 years and has two daughters, Kristen (23), a 2019 Bethel College Grad, and Samantha (21), who is in her Junior year at Adrian College.

REGION 6 – **BRAD BUSH**, CAA (Chelsea High School) is a graduate of Ypsilanti High School. Brad played quarterback at Cornell University from 1988-90 and was a member of the 1988 Ivy League championship team. Brad holds a Bachelor's degree from Eastern Michigan University in History and Exercise Science, along with



a Master's Degree in Sports Management from Eastern Michigan University. He began his career in educational athletics at his alma mater, Ypsilanti High School, in 1991 as an assistant Football coach. In 1993, Brad took a teaching and assistant Football coach position at East Kentwood High School, where he spent four years before taking the head Football coaching job and a teaching position at Chelsea High School in 1997. Brad spent 21 years as the head Varsity Football at Chelsea before retiring in 2019. In 2013, Brad assumed the title of Athletic Director and Assistant Principal at Chelsea, a position he has held for the past seven years. An active member of the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association, Brad has been named an eight-time Regional Coach of the Year and was the 2015 Division 3 State Coach of the Year 2015. He served as the MHSFCA Treasurer from 2007-15. the MHSFCA Ethics Committee Chair from 2014-15. the MHSFCA President in 2016. and is a current board member. Dr. Julie Hebner, Superintendent of Chelsea Schools, writes that "Brad understands and accepts that to be an exemplary athletic director; the clock and the calendar do not mean much. Not everyone is willing to make the sacrifice of time and energy that he has willingly made to help make Chelsea a great place for kids. Brad has the ability to build warm professional relationships with students and coaches while still maintaining high expectations for their performance. He is an excellent example for children, a tremendous supporter to coaches, and a wonderful colleague for teachers and administrators." In addition to his work at the high school level, Brad has also spent time as an assistant Football coach at Eastern Michigan University, serving as a running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. Brad is married to his wife Laura and has three children, Janie, Jack, and Grace.

REGION 7 – SCOTT CASTEELE (Lansing Waverly) is a graduate of Maple Valley High School. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Communications and Teacher Education from Albion College before heading to Western Michigan University to complete a Master's Degree in Educational Leadership. While at Albion College, Scott was named to the All-MIAA team, was a team captain, and was a member of the 1994 Albion NCAA Division III National Championship Football team. Scott has spent 25 years in education as a teacher, coach, and athletic director. He began his career as a fifth-grade teacher in the Albion Public Schools district, where he spent 10 years. While at Albion, Scott also coached high school Football and Track for three years and was also an assistant coach for the Albion College Football team for four years. Scott later moved on to Fowlerville High School, where he served as athletic director for nine years before taking his current position at Waverly High School, where he has spent the last six years. Christopher Huff, Principal at Waverly High School, remarks that "Scott is intimately involved in ensuring the best possible athletic experience for our community. I can confidently say that Scott has a lifechanging impact on those around him because I have experienced his mentorship firsthand. Scott was one of my coaches in college and was instrumental in my development as a student-athlete by modeling the principles of hard work and determination. Every day I see that same mentorship and guidance in his work with our coaching staffs and student-athletes. Scott has a hands-on approach. He can often be found not far from the sidelines or the huddle. He makes sure that our coaches and athletes get what they need, whether that is positive affirmation or honest feedback. He holds the same high expectations for our Athletic Program as he does for himself." An active member of the MIAAA and NIAAA, Scott has hosted over 50 MHSAA tournaments in his career and has served on the MHSAA Scholar Athlete Committee for three years. While at Waverly, he oversaw back-to-back MHSAA Division 2 State Champion Track and Field teams in 2016-17. He has been a volunteer for the MHSAA at the State Final events for Soccer, Baseball, and Softball and has served as a Security Guard at Michigan International Speedway for 24 years. Scott is the proud father of one daughter, Leilani, who is currently a Junior at Mason High School.

REGION 8 – **MITCH BOHN** (Meridian Early College High School) is a graduate of Freeland High School. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics from Central Michigan University and also holds a Master's Degree in Secondary Administration from Central Michigan. For the past 24 years, Mitch has served as Athletic Director at Meridian Early College High School. During this time, he has also been a math teacher and Dean of Students, a title that he currently holds. An active member of BCAM, Mitch has been named a Regional Coach of the Year three times and has over 400 career wins during his career coaching Boys Varsity Basketball between Meridian, Laker High School, and Iona Prep in New York. Patrick Malley, current Chief Academic Officer at Bay City Schools and former Principal at Meridian, writes "Mitch is a strong leader, a fact that is quickly evident when you meet him. When he speaks, others tend to listen. Whether it be in small meetings about our school programs or in large gatherings involving our entire conference, you get the sense that his voice matters. His willingness to put himself and his ideas out there always helped advance our goals. His greatest strength, though, is his commitment to relationships with students. He has a way of connecting with young people as adults that they

respond well to. He is demanding, yet charming. The same directness I felt from him as his supervisor, our students felt from him as their A.D. No doubt, this has aided in his success as a school administrator and coach over the years." He has been a member of the MHSAA Boys Basketball Site Selection and Rules committees. Recently, Mitch helped in an effort to raise funds for the repainting of the gym floor at Meridian and served on a volunteer group, during the flood cleanup, known as BFI. Mitch is married to his wife Keeley and has a daughter, Madeleine, and a son, Brett.

REGION 9 - CHRIS DEINES, RAA (Ortonville Brandon) is a graduate of Greenville High School. He holds a Bachelor's degree in K-12 Physical Education and 6-12 Health Education from Grand Valley State University along with a Master's Degree in Teaching from Marygrove College. Chris began his career in education in 2000 as a high school baseball and football coach at Greenville High School while also serving as a teacher beginning in 2004. In 2006, he took a position at Durand, teaching K-8 Physical Education, serving as the head Varsity Baseball coach, and as an assistant coach in Varsity Boys and Girls Basketball and Varsity Football. In 2012, he was named Athletic Director, Community Education, and Facility Use Director at Durand. Chris took the Athletic Director position at Ortonville Brandon in 2016 where he has served since and recently added a High School Assistant Principal title to his position in 2020. He served as an MHSAA registered official from 2009-11, the Flint Metro League Secretary in 2016, and the Flint Metro League President from 2017-19. Chris is currently the Region 9 Alternate Representative, a member of the MHSAA Basketball Tournament Officials Selection Committee, and a presenter at the MIAAA Annual Conference. Mike Bakker, CMAA, Athletic Director at Fenton High School, notes that "Chris understands the impact that the field of Athletics can have on people and a community and that is why he has always been willing to open his facilities and give his time to the community, Flint Metro League, and state. Through Chris' enthusiasm, hard work, careful planning, and leadership the Brandon Athletic Department has continued to build on past success and is looked at as a leader in our area. His dedication to Educational Athletics continues to provide opportunities for the students and coaches of Brandon Schools to find success and experience the vital importance that sports plays in the development in our students." Chris was named a 2013 Baseball District Coach of Year and 2013 Genesee Area Conference Baseball Coach of Year while at Durand. From 2012-16, he ran Durand Community Enrichment classes and created the Flint Metro League-Genesee Area Conference Coaches vs. Cancer Basketball Challenge to raise funds for the American Cancer Society. Additionally, Chris has organized the First Responder-Military Appreciation Cause at Brandon, a game that honors a local Oakland County Sheriff's Deputy and former Brandon Liaison Officer who was killed in the line of duty on Thanksgiving morning of 2017. Funds raised from this event go toward a scholarship given to a graduating Senior that wishes to pursue a career in law enforcement, the military or the frontline medical field. A proud supporter, advocate and representative of Hurley Children's Hospital and the Children's Miracle Network, Chris has been married to his wife Danielle for eight years and has two children, Hadlee (7) and Brodie (4).



Special Recognition Award Bill Mick Midland Schools and MIAAA

Bill Mick began his career in education as a Science teacher, Physical Education teacher, and Counselor at Bullock Creek Schools in 1963. In 1976, Bill moved to the Midland School District where he served as a Counselor at Midland High School for three years before moving over to a similar role at Midland Dow for six years. In 1985, he was named the District Athletic Director for the Midland School District, a role he held for 12 years. Bill completed his education career as a part-time Counselor at Windover High School and Bullock Creek High School. Bill has demonstrated a commitment to serving the MHSAA and MIAAA in addition to his community. He managed the MHSAA State Track meet for three years, coached Basketball, Football, Track, and Cross Country at Bullock Creek, and has been an MHSAA CAP Instructor and MIAAA Conference speaker and presider. Bill continues to serve the MIAAA as a Conference Program Committee Chair, Life Member Committee Co-Chair, and Summer Conference Co-Chair. His work in educational athletics has been recognized in Midland and across the state of Michigan. He was named the Midland Elk of the Year in 1995, an ACE Award of Midland County Education winner in 1995, the ATOM President's Leadership Award winner in 1997, an MIAAA Regional A.D. of the Year in 1997, the Lloyd Osborn Award winner in 1997, inducted into the Midland County Hall of Fame in 1998, inducted into the Windover High School Hall of Honor in 2003, and the Circle of Health Community Hero Award winner in 2008. As a husband, he once told me, teasingly, not to plan on having our babies around State Finals in March or 'I'd be going it alone!' Our two sons were born in August." Bill's son Nathan remembers "Dad, as a former high school and college player and then high school coach, fostered a love of sports, particularly basketball. I remember him opening the gym for us on weekends and school vacations so that we could play. We even had a running pre-Thanksgiving Day "Dad's vs. Kids" game that became very competitive as we got into high school. He modeled the discipline required to make physical fitness a habit. He ran six days a week into his fifties and then switched over to biking and weight lifting when he got 'old' and his joints started to remind him of the wear and tear over the years." Bill's son Andrew notes "Looking back now with the perspective of having my own career, I am amazed at how my dad always put his family first. As I got older, I began to appreciate all that he did professionally and what he accomplished while I was growing up. But at the time, all I knew was that for every one of my sports competitions, school events, or life milestones, he was there supporting me. With age, I also realize the impact he had on me, by seeing him consistently working hard, treating others with respect, and doing the right thing regardless of the personal cost. To this day, when I am confronted with a difficult decision, I think about what my dad would do in that situation. So, in many ways, despite being thousands of miles away, he continues to always be there supporting me." In addition to his work in education and athletics, Bill has provided countless hours of service to the Midland community. Among the many leadership roles he has taken on include service as a Midland Catholic Family Service Board of Directors member, the Midland County Amateur Sports Capital Committee Chair and Treasurer, the Midland County Sports Hall of Fame Banquet Chair, the Midland American Red Cross Board Chair, and the Midland County AIDS Task Force Chair and Vice Chair. Bill has been married to his wife Mary Lou for over 50 years. He has two sons and daughters-inlaw and two granddaughters spread across the country in Maine and California.

George Lovich State Award of Merit Marty Gottesman


Bay City Schools and Saginaw Valley League
